VOTE411.org has had a great response from the public and League members as a nonpartisan, one-stop resource for election information! VOTE411.org provides a nationwide polling place locator, as well as general and state-specific information on absentee ballot rules, early voting provisions, ID requirements, voting machine types, tools for overseas citizens, and contact information for elections officials. On Election Day alone, over ¾ of a million people visited VOTE411.org and viewed over 3 million pages of election information that helped them be prepared to vote. The LWV.org Web site also saw a great deal of traffic, having almost 65,000 visitors on Election Day alone and over 230,000 in the week leading up to the election. #### **Make Sure Provisional Ballots are Counted!**

Please remind voters in your community who voted provisionally to follow up with their local elections officials about their provisional ballots: some voters may need to show ID, while others may need to show proof of registration, etc, but ALL provisional voters should find out if their provisional vote counted and if not, why not. All states have a free access system for voters to use to find out if their provisional ballot was counted. If their provisional ballot was not counted, elections officials should explain why so voters can take any necessary action to ensure their vote counts at the next election. ### **ADVOCACY**

#### **Congressional leadership Urged to Enact Real Ethics Reform**

The LWVUS issued an action alert urging activists and League members represented by party leadership to insist that those leaders pledge to enact real reform in the wake of congressional scandal. A fundamental overhaul of the House ethics process is required. House leaders must create an Office of Public Integrity to allow outside complaints to be filed and provide for an independent fact-finding process.

#### **League and Coalition Partners Hold Ethics Press Event (NEW)**

LWVUS President Wilson was in Washington to lead six coalition groups in [releasing a statement](#) urging the new Congress to take immediate action on lobbying and ethics reforms, in particular urging Congress to develop an independent ethics enforcement entity. The event was sponsored by the Campaign Legal Center, Common Cause, Democracy 21, League of Women Voters, Public Citizen and U.S. PIRG.

### **Update on LWVIL Immigration Study**

Please mark your calendars for the Immigration unit meeting on **January 11** and the consensus meeting on **February 8**. This is a relevant and timely subject that affects us all.

Why the immigration study? Before League can take action, members must agree in broad terms on what they think about the various aspects of a public policy issue – the League position. **LWVIL does not have a position on Immigration.** We need to assume the responsibility of a large voting state with a large immigrant population, a state that will lead in immigration policy-setting. Ponder the following quote:

**“A small number of states—California, Florida, Texas, New York, New Jersey and Illinois—have large populations of voters as well as large numbers of immigrants. These states tend to shape immigration policy because issues emerge first in these places as problems that need immediate solutions.” (LWVMN)**

To determine a position, the League must answer the following question:

**How should Illinois respond to the challenges and opportunities of immigration in the areas of economic policy, social policy, including education, and the governmental process?**

### **Update on LWVIL Immigration Study (continued)**

One method to determine member agreement is by consensus, a process whereby members participate in a group discussion of an issue. The accord reached by the group is not a simple majority, nor unanimity, but rather the overall sense of the group. It is a dynamic process. The discussion evokes an exchange of ideas, areas of agreement evolve and opinions crystallize.

Following is a brief listing of issues on which **we need your participation** to come to a true consensus and determine a State position. (For the full text of individual Consensus Questions, as well as resource material to help respond to them, go to [lwvil.org](http://lwvil.org) and click on Immigration Study.):

- Immigrants often face significant challenges learning to assimilate and to go about their daily lives after relocating to the United States. Should the State fund relocation orientation and counseling?
- Undocumented workers are frequently the victims of exploitation in the workplace. Should the State fund workplace-rights education?
- Should the State allow undocumented immigrants to drive legally and be insured?
- Undocumented immigrants are reluctant to use financial institutions; they are frequently targeted by criminals. Should financial institutions be required to accept identification issued by countries of origin?
- Some studies show that undocumented immigrants burden local economies by educating their youth at public schools (K-12) and by their use of emergency healthcare services. Should the State create a set-aside fund to help local taxing bodies offset these costs.
- Taxation without representation? Immigrant voting is not expressly prohibited by the U.S. Constitution, but the Illinois constitution requires U.S. citizenship for voter registration in the state. Should the State allow immigrants the right to vote in certain local elections?
- Should there be laws penalizing landlords for renting to undocumented immigrants and/or prohibiting the issuance of business permits to the undocumented?
- The legal status of an immigrant may be revealed during the course of a routine traffic stop. Should state and local police be deputized so that they can enforce immigration laws in Illinois?

Please prioritize the unit meeting on January 11 and the consensus meeting on February 8 to give your input on these issues. Venues will be announced.

The Coast Guard will certainly take into account comments from governmental bodies. It might also be helpful for individuals to write their Senators and Congressmen.

*Text of Resolution***RESOLUTION NO. \_\_\_\_\_****A RESOLUTION OF THE \_\_\_\_\_ COUNCIL OF \_\_\_\_\_, OPPOSING COAST GUARD LIVE FIRING TRAINING EXERCISES ON THE GREAT LAKES**

**WHEREAS** the Great Lakes, home to 20% of the world's fresh surface water, are balancing on the tip of their ecological breaking point, and scientists in the region agree that we must restore the resilience of the lakes, or we may push them beyond the point of no return; and

**WHEREAS** the Great Lakes are not immune to global conflict, and we recognize the need to enhance security nationwide, but there are significant gaps in the justification of such a broad training program; and

**WHEREAS** a healthy future for the Great Lakes is wholly reliant on our intervention and we realize it is our responsibility to restore the lakes to greatness because they are a resource for all of us to both use and protect; and

**WHEREAS** a decision to create 34 zones where long-distance lead ammunition will be fired during boating season constitutes a major federal action under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and should be subjected to an environmental assessment or, preferably, an environmental impact statement; and

**WHEREAS** the Great Lakes are virtually a closed system, with less than one percent of the water in the lakes renewed each year, and what we put in the lakes generally stays in the lakes; and

**WHEREAS** pollutants have been building up in the Great Lakes ecosystem for many years and some persistent chemicals, including lead compounds found in bullets, can enter the food chain at the most basic levels, ending up in humans through the fish we eat and the water we drink, affecting development and survival for generations, linked to developmental delays in children, attention deficit disorders, impaired immune systems, reproductive disorders, diabetes, and heart disease; and

**WHEREAS** the Great Lakes support tourism, recreation, and a \$5 billion sport fishing industry that is absolutely dependent on recreational boating, a major portion of the lifeblood of our regional economy and economic growth, and critical to the Great Lakes states; and

**WHEREAS** the Coast Guard's "Preliminary Health Risk Assessment for Proposed U.S. Coast Guard Weapons Training Exercises" concerning the amount of lead to be discharged into surface waters provides only a short-sighted, 5-year outlook for potential problems; does not consider the locations of critical habitat, special-status species, or potable water intakes; and fails to account for cumulative regional impacts of lead on organisms at the bottom of the food chain;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the \_\_\_\_\_ Council of the City of \_\_\_\_\_ asks that the Coast Guard:

- Expand their commitment to the ecosystem, prior to implementation, by performing a substantive environmental review that fulfills requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA); and reducing the number of live fire sites to the level critically necessary for training;
- Develop a new iteration of the plan with the full cooperation and support of recreational boaters and anglers, focusing on a reduction in the number of training sites to a level that is agreeable to the recreational user;
- Consider the full range of lead reduction strategies;
- Pursue specific lead-reduction strategies including the use of non-lead bullets and on-shore simulators such as those used at Great Lakes Naval Training Center in Lake County, Illinois; and
- Postpone implementation of the plan as described.
