


Glen Ellyn households under age 35 are more likely to rent; homeownership rates increase as income increases

In 2020, most younger households were renters and lived in multifamily units. In contrast, householders over age 35 were predominantly homeowners. Similarly, households with lower incomes were more likely to be renters than those with higher incomes.

Approximately 65% of households age 65+ live in single-family homes, which may indicate that there is not enough housing variety to age in place. These housing choices are limited by the availability of housing types.
