### Recap of LWVIL 2023 State Convention

The biennial LWVIL State Convention took place on June 10-11, 2023. Delegates from all over the state met virtually to vote on officers, approve the budget, and adopt the program for 2023-2025. LWVGE delegates were Barbara Kwiatkowsky; Judy Kinn; Michelle Thorsell; Sarah Allen; Erica Nelson; Kim Reed; Brit Murphy; and Maria Metz.

Items of note that passed were to keep the dues at \$32 per member for the next two years, to adopt the three pillars of Action Foci, which are: Voting Rights and Election Processes; Environment/Climate Crisis; and Equitably Meeting Basic Human Needs; and to undertake a study to update the LWVIL Gun Violence Prevention policy.

Becky Simon, our featured speaker at the August Kick-off meeting, was elected as LWVIL President, and our very own members, Michelle Thorsell, was elected as LWVIL Secretary, and Erica Nelson was elected to the LWVIL Nominating Committee. We will also have two of our members serving as

Issues Specialists for 2023-2025, Jacquelyn Casazza (Environment/Waste) and Kim Reed (Immigration). We are very thankful that several of our own Glen Ellyn members have stepped up to take these leadership roles at the state level.

### **Gun Violence Prevention Study**

As mentioned above, the LWVIL is undertaking a study to update the current LWVIL Gun Violence Prevention (GVP) policy. The LWVUS position on GVP, last updated in 1998, supports strong federal measures to regulate the ownership of handguns and assault weapons. The LWVIL position, last updated in 1989, additionally supports a ban on the manufacture and sale of handguns, assault weapons and their ammunition.

Much has changed in the ensuing years, gun ownership has skyrocketed, mass shootings happen all too frequently, and untraceable guns can be made on 3D printers. The LWVIL Issues & Advocacy committee reviewed the position and determined that to advocate effectively for gun violence prevention the policy needs to be studied and possibly updated.

As Becky mentioned at our meeting, LWVIL is looking for volunteers for the core study group which will meet virtually. In addition, LWVIL is asking each local league to form a group to provide feedback on the work of the core group. We emphasized on-line registration and communicated information about next year's elections. Each person we interacted with also got a pack of Smarties. It was a lot of fun. A week later on August 11, another team hosted an information table at the Monarch Festival in Glendale Heights. The Monarch Festival is an annual Hispanic cultural event featuring music and dance as well as celebrating the monarch butterfly. The festival is staged by Immigrant Solidarity DuPage. We interacted with 50-75

### **Affordable Housing Update**



"Fight for the things that you care about, but do it in a way that will lead others to join you."

Safe, quality affordable housing is essential to the health and well-being of individuals, families and the community. This has been a long-standing LWVGE position.

Consistent with LWVGE's local housing position, we engaged with local leaders and other community groups in advocating for affordable, accessible and supportive housing on the newly owned Village Property on Taft and Exmoor.

We joined in advocacy efforts along with other leaders from DuPage United, Families with I/DD, Habitat For Humanity, Bridge Communities, Hope Fair Housing as well as their clients. We created a powerful voice of caring responsible citizenry and raised a platform for those who need affordable, supportive housing to advocate for themselves.

- League demonstrated our strength through our presence and our reasonable comments during the 4-month Village Listening Sessions held last summer, as well as at Village Board Meetings.
- League showed respect to those with opposing views.
- League demonstrated responsible civil engagement by:
  - Providing individual testimonies;
  - Attending key Village board meetings and having LWVGE officers submitting statements in support of the affordable option for the Roosevelt/Taft property;
  - (as individuals), Signing a petition to support affordable supportive housing on the Taft and Exmoor site; and
  - Providing community education and engagement through our monthly programming and our website.

The Village of Glen Ellyn has not made a decision on the property to date. We do know that developer, Full Circle Communities, and Village leaders continue to be in meaningful discussions about their housing development proposal. The July 16th front page Daily Herald article highlighted our community's advocacy efforts to provide needed affordable housing for our residents. Congresswoman Delia Ramirez has applied for up to \$750,000 in funding to assist the Village in the demolition of existing buildings on this property.

So as we await the Village's decision on the development of this property, we can feel satisfied that our League has worked very hard in advocating for safe, quality, affordable housing in Glen Ellyn.

### **Social Justice**

#### What is Social Justice?

The League of Women Voters is not just about voting rights. It is also about human rights and social justice. Over the hundred plus years since its founding, LWV has worked to illuminate social justice ISSUES and promote ADVOCACY to effect change at local, state and national levels.



These social justice issues are numerous and include Equal Rights for Women. The Illinois General Assembly recently passed (with LWVIL lobbying) HJR20, a resolution affirming that the Equal Rights Amendment is fully ratified and calling on the White House to publish the ERA as our 28th Amendment. LWV continues to support the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) and advocates for basic human needs, such as fair housing. As reported in the article above, fair housing is a current focus of LWVGE advocacy efforts. League lobbied for curbing violence in our communities and legislation that regulates firearms in a responsible manner. LWVIL also lobbied in support of HB2789 Right to Read, imposing fines for banning books.

The LWVGE Social Justice/ Issues & Advocacy Mission is *To educate LWVGE members* and community voters to increase awareness of social justice issues and their impact on our community and to engage voters to become advocates for social justice. We are currently working on a Social Justice Bill of Rights, updating the League Website, and a 2024 Program on Immigration. We are always looking for new members to join us! The League of Women Voters of Glen Ellyn (LWVGE) announced the winners of the inaugural 2023 Glenbard Democracy Challenge: Angie Abraham, a sophomore at Glenbard West and Emily Puchalski, a junior at Glenbard South. Both students were awarded a \$500 cash prize for their efforts at the LWVGE's annual meeting on April 27th. This year's theme was "In Defense of Democracy." The challenge asked students to portray the theme through music, photography, dance, creative writing, art, video, etc.

The Glenbard Democracy Challenge is named for longtime Glen Ellyn resident and League member
Charlotte Swett Walter, whose estate bequeathed funds to support LWVGE educational efforts. # **Environmental News and Volunteer Opportunity**

At the January 2023 LWVGE State of the Village meeting, a question was raised about pick-up lines at schools. The lines are extensive, and cars are leaving their engines on/idling and polluting the air for the nearby residents and children.

According to the "Idle-Free Schools Presentation" on epa.gov, "Idling engines produce thousands of tons of toxic pollution per year" and "children's developing lungs have a smaller

surface area and a higher inhalation rate, which means greater exposure and potentially permanent damage to lung function".

The League sparked into action! An anti-idling committee has been meeting since March to work on an anti-idling campaign, guided by our position statement:

"The LWV of Illinois advocates...for the protection of the air, land, and water, to promote healthy ecosystems, biodiversity and a clean and healthful environment."

WE NEED YOU! We are going to start observing traffic patterns at area schools for a couple of weeks 9/11-9/29. It will take approximately 45 minutes on two/three afternoons and you'll be partnered with 4-5 other League members. 

League members visited Hadley Junior High School in May to talk about the importance of community involvement, and that one person can make a difference.


The League was recognized by the District for our time and efforts, as well as by the over 300 students we spoke to who filled out 10 "thank you" cards!


**Observer Corps: Promoting Transparency in Government**
